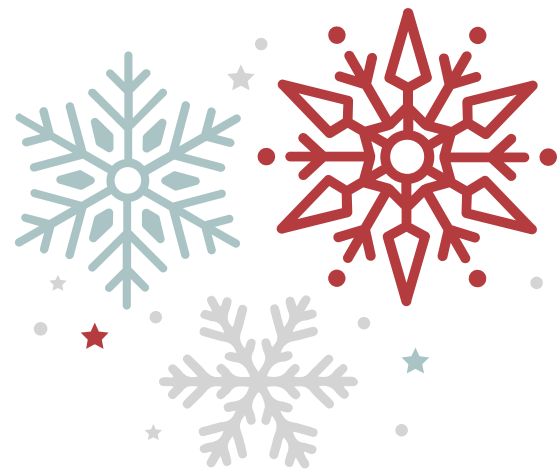

COMPOST SITE

The Village of Mount Pleasant Municipal Code [70-8](#) prohibits property owners from raking or placing leaves, branches, or other refuse onto any street highway or public right-of-way within the Village. Proof of Mount Pleasant residency is required to use the Compost Site.

Leaf Disposal

Mount Pleasant does not pick up leaves curbside. Residents may bring their leaves to the Village Compost Site.

Compost Restrictions

Only the following materials are accepted at the Compost Site: grass clippings, garden waste, leaves that are separated from branches, and brush/branches (maximum 7' long and 4" diameter). NO milled lumber or fencing, sod, soil, rocks, concrete, garlic mustard, garbage or recyclables will be accepted.

Saturday: 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM

The Compost Site will re-open in April 2023 when weather conditions are adequate.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

Christmas tree collection begins January 9, 2023 and will run for a two-week period. Trees will be picked up on your regular trash collection day.



Trees must be free from decorations and lights. Residents should place trees at the curb line or edge of the roadway, DO NOT place trees on the road. Live wreaths can be placed with your regular trash collection. Tree

collection dates may be altered due to poor weather conditions. The Village will post delay announcements on our website and social media accounts. You can find a list of Village social media accounts on page 2.

SNOW REMOVAL



The Village would like to remind residents and property owners of our Municipal Code regulating snow and ice removal from sidewalks. Section [70-6](#) mandates that "...occupants or owners of every building, tenement, or premises fronting upon any street within the Village, and the owners or any unoccupied building or premise fronting on any street in the Village, shall keep the sidewalks adjoining such premises reasonably free and clear of snow and ice and, after and during every snow, such persons shall clear the snow from such sidewalks before 10:00 AM of each day. No snow or ice shall be placed upon any street, alley, highway, road, sidewalk, and crosswalk."

SNOW EMERGENCY

If a Snow Emergency is declared in Mount Pleasant by the Public Works Department, the Mount Pleasant Police Department will notify the media. Snow emergencies will remain in effect until snowplowing or salting operations have been declared completed by the Village. Per Village Code [78-140](#) during snow emergencies, vehicle parking on public streets, highways, or alleyways within the Village is prohibited for periods of 30 minutes or more. Residents are asked to be mindful of snow emergencies to allow the snowplows to clear the roads as quickly as possible.



GARBAGE & RECYCLING

Mount Pleasant contracts with GFL Environmental to provide trash disposal and recycling collection for residents. Residents are assigned an "A" or "B" collection week depending on their property location. Not sure if you are collection week A or B? You can find your assigned week [HERE](#). Did you know there is a proper way to place your trash and recycling bins? Ensure your collection isn't missed by reviewing GFL's container placement guidelines [HERE](#). Sometimes it can be a little confusing what items can and can't be recycled. A list of acceptable items for recycling can be found [HERE](#).

Holiday Pickup Schedule

All routes are delayed by one day following a no-

pickup holiday. For example, if Christmas Day is Tuesday and normal service day is Wednesday, you will be serviced on Thursday. Customers who are normally serviced on Friday of the week, will be serviced on Saturday. Holidays that fall on a weekend do not impact the pickup schedule. There will be no garbage or recycling pickup on the following holidays:

- New Years Day
- Martin Luther King Jr. Day
- Memorial Day
- Independence Day
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving Day
- Christmas Day

Did you know Wisconsin State Statute [346.915](#) mandates how closely vehicle operators may follow a snowplow engaged in winter maintenance? In posted speed limits of 35+ MPH, vehicle operators are required to leave 200 feet distance between their vehicle and the plow truck.

Online Payments

E-Check and credit card payments can be paid on our website [HERE](#). Point & Pay does charge a fee for this service. Credit card payments are subject to 2.39% fee of the payment amount. Each e-check is a \$1.50 fee.

Property tax bills will be mailed in December. All cash payments should be made at Johnson Bank. The Village Hall secure dropbox is located outside of the Village Hall Main Entrance doors, on the east wall. Include the following in your envelope: parcel or bill number on the check, phone number on check, tax bill payment stub, endorsement on back of escrow checks - make sure all parties have signed. Include a self addressed stamped envelope for a receipt. Receipts can also be printed online [HERE](#).

Payment Due Dates

Your payment must be postmarked by December 31, 2022 to be applied in 2022. To avoid penalties, full payment or first installment must be paid by January 31, 2023. If paying in installments, your second installment is due and payable to the Racine County Treasurer by July 31, 2023. Mount Pleasant cannot accept second installment payments.

Additional Information

Any payment, including online payments, returned by your bank or cancelled will be assessed a \$25 fee. If your escrow check exceeds the amount due, a refund will be mailed to you 6-8 weeks after the payment clears all banks. Do not combine any other payments (pet license, sewer payment, etc.) with your property tax payment.

PROPERTY TAX BILL CREDITS

Lottery and Gaming Credit

If you do not have a Lottery and Gaming credit on your tax bill you may still be eligible! To Qualify: Your home must have been the PRIMARY residence for you or the previous owner on January 1, 2022. If you believe you qualify for the Lottery Credit, you may obtain the Lottery Credit Claim Form [HERE](#). The completed form should be returned to the Village Clerk-Treasurer's Office prior to January 31, 2023. Residents needing assistance with completing the form should contact the Clerk-Treasurer's Office.

First Dollar Credit

If your real estate bill has an "assessed value improvement" amount, the credit should automatically show on your tax bill. Anyone entitled to the credit that did not receive it, must appeal directly to the Wisconsin Department of Revenue at (608) 266-2486.

SEWER UTILITY BILLS

Quarterly bills are mailed 3/31, 6/30, 9/30, and 12/31 and are due the last day of the following month.

2023 ELECTIONS

Election Dates

- February 21, 2023 - Spring Primary (if necessary)
- April 4, 2023 - Spring Election

If a Spring Primary is necessary, the deadline for voters to register by mail or online is February 1, 2023. After that, voters must register in person in the Clerk's office or at their polling place on Election Day. The last day to request an absentee ballot be mailed to you is February 13, 2023. 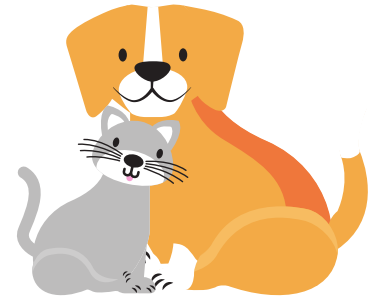
PET LICENSING

It's time to renew dog and cat licenses! Pet licenses are valid from January 1 through December 31. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required with your application. You can find the application [HERE](#).

Why should you license your pet?

- State Law and Village Ordinance require licensing your dogs and cats in Mount Pleasant.
- Ensures residents and their pets are protected from rabies.
- Lost pets who are licensed can be reunited with their owners quickly.

Residents are reminded of [Village Ordinances](#) which prohibit dogs being at large and also require owners to pick up after their pets.



PIKE RIVER PATHWAY

Project History

Mount Pleasant completed its multi-phase Pike River restoration project in 2017, which restored hundreds of acres of land along five miles of the Pike River. 2019 marked the completion of the Pike River Pathway trail system from Old Spring Street to County Line Road. The Village actively pursued grant funding for corridor development, stream restoration, land acquisition, and other habitat improvements. Mount Pleasant received over \$9.5 million in local, state, and federal grants for the project. As a result of the acquisition and donation of land within the corridor, the Village acquired approximately 450 acres. In addition to controlling flooding, the Village restored natural stream features, enhanced aquatic habitats within the stream, and connected ponds and wetlands. To provide a natural preserve along the river, the Village planted native prairie vegetation and trees. The completion of this project also resulted in the removal of over 120 properties from floodplains.

Record Flooding

In September 2022, Racine County received record flooding. Between six and ten inches of rain fell in the

Mount Pleasant area. In this photo, taken from CTH KR looking north, you can see the floodwaters held by the connected ponds. This is an excellent example of the restoration work doing what it is designed to do during heavy rainfalls – keep flooding within the corridor.

Pathway Amenities

The Pike River Pathway trail system has over five miles of year-round multi-use, off-road bike and walking trails spanning from Old Spring Street to CTH KR. The pathway has eight public access points and two bike repair stations. Along the pathway, outdoor enthusiasts will find natural prairies, Northern Pike fish in the river, and various wildlife. We encourage residents to take a weekend to Bike the Pike!

- Durand Avenue (east of Cottage Drive – near 7612 Durand Avenue)
- Braun Road (1/2 a mile east of Willow Road)

2023 VILLAGE BUDGET

Taxing Jurisdictions

The Village Board approved the 2023 budget on November 14, 2022. Mount Pleasant property taxes support four taxing jurisdictions: Village of Mount Pleasant, Racine County, Racine Unified School District, and Gateway Technical College. When property owners pay their real estate tax bill, each one dollar is distributed in the following manner:

- **Gateway Technical College**
\$0.04 -or- 4%
- **Mount Pleasant**
\$0.35 -or- 35%
- **Racine County**
\$0.18 -or- 18%
- **Racine Unified School District**
\$0.43 -or- 43%

Mill Rate

The mill rate is calculated by dividing the total taxes needed by the total assessed value of Mount Pleasant and multiplying by 1,000. The mill rate for Mount Pleasant 2022 property taxes is \$6.26 per \$1,000. Property tax dollars are used to pay for village services. Each \$6.26 is allocated in the following manner:

- **PUBLIC SAFETY | \$3.76**
Supports the Mount Pleasant Police Department protection services, South Shore Fire Station protection services, and Racine County Dispatch services.
- **PUBLIC WORKS | \$0.55**
Supports the maintenance, repair and snow clearing of approximately 133 miles of road and right-of-way. Also supports compost site operations, solid waste and recycling collection.
- **GENERAL ADMINISTRATION | \$0.16**
Supports the operations of Administration, Attorney, Clerk/Treasurer, Community Development, Assessor, Election, Finance, Information Technology, Human Resources, Municipal Court, and Village Board departments.
- **PARKS & RECREATION | \$0.10**
Supports the maintenance and operations of nine parks totaling over 300 acres, as well as funding for Joint Park. Also supports the various park recreational programs.
- **DEBT SERVICE | \$0.87**
Accounts for revenue and expenses related to Village payments for principal and interest for bond issues.
- **CAPITAL | \$0.68**
Supports capital projects for roads, buildings, protective services and village hall equipment.
- **SHARED | \$0.14**
Supports shared services with Racine and Racine County including bus services and public health services.

WARMING CENTERS

Winter Warming Centers are places for people to seek temporary relief from extreme cold temperatures.

Racine County has several designated warming centers located throughout the County for those needing relief from temperatures 25 degrees or less. The following five warming locations are the closest to Mount Pleasant Village Hall:

PORCH PIRATES

As the holiday season approaches, online purchasing and package delivery will be in full swing. Porch pirates, or thieves who steal deliveries off porches and doorsteps, can strike any time of year, but their crime tends to increase during the holidays when they are on the lookout for unattended packages. If you plan to shop online, here are some precautions you can take to help avoid package theft any time of the year:

Ship to the store

Have your package delivered directly to the store. Most stores allow you to designate an alternate pick-up person.

Request signature confirmation

Your package cannot be left at your door because you must be there to sign for it.

Deliver at work

If you can, have your packages sent to your work.

Use an Amazon Locker

Have your package delivered to a locker hub in the area. Once delivered, you receive a code to open the locker and retrieve your package.

Deliver to a friend or family member's house

Do you know someone who will be home during the day? Ask them if you can send your package to their house to keep it safe.

Use a secure mailbox service

Sign up for a P.O. Box at the Post Office or a mailbox at The UPS Store.

When placing your order, be sure to sign up for tracking and delivery notifications so you can monitor the delivery

status of your packages. If you have a video doorbell or security cameras, be sure to customize the motion sensitivity and view area settings to detect activity when you are not home.

As the winter weather starts, the South Shore Fire Department would like to remind residents of the Adopt-A-Hydrant program. During heavy snowfalls many of our fire hydrants get buried, making it difficult for our firefighters to locate and access them during an emergency when every second counts. Help South Shore Fire by becoming a hydrant hero! Select a hydrant close to your home or business. After a snowfall:

- **Clear your hydrant of ice and snow.**
- **Keep a three-foot clearance around the hydrant.**
- **Clear a path from the hydrant to the street.**

A cleared hydrant is a happy hydrant! Have an elderly neighbor? Take a few minutes to help shovel out their hydrants as well. Spread the word and encourage others to adopt hydrants near them!

Candle Safety

- Keep candles 12 inches away from objects that can easily get hot or burn.
- Keep hair, loose clothing, and pets away from the flame.
- Never use candles in a home where there is medical oxygen.

Be sure you never leave a room that has burning candles. When you go out, blow it out!

Christmas Tree Safety

Are you adding a live tree as part of your Christmas décor this year? Read these tips to keep your house safe this holiday season.

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles.
- Keep the tree three feet away from heat sources such as fireplaces, heat vents, or radiators and never block an exit.
- Be sure your tree lights are intended for indoor use.
- Water, water, water your tree daily!

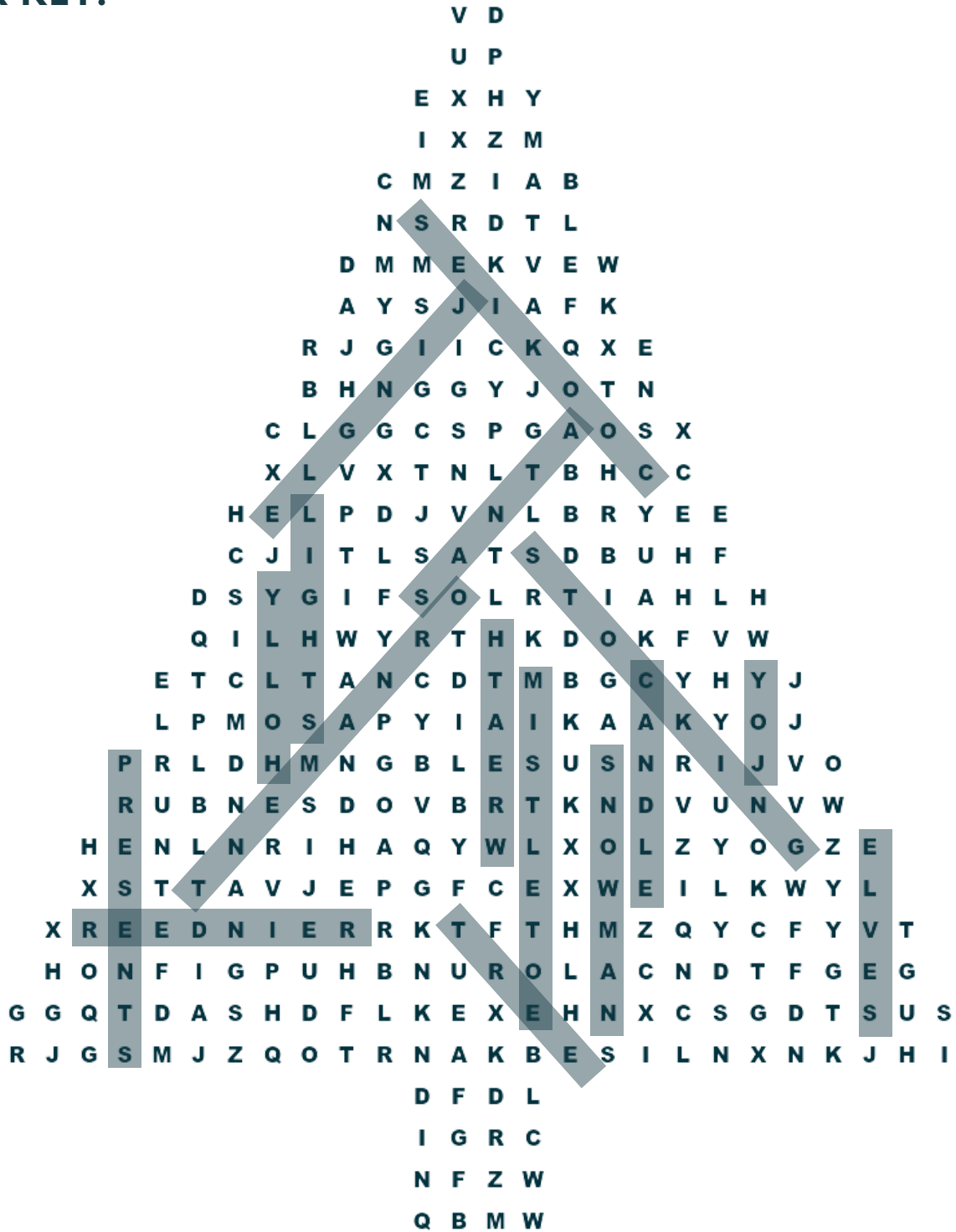
